

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. FIVE

(Note: All or parts of this charter ordinance have been repealed. See notes at the end of the ordinance.)

A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS, FROM G.S. 1949, 13-1420, AND PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE AND ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS ON THE SAME SUBJECT; PROVIDING FOR DESIGNATION OF THE OFFICIAL CITY NEWSPAPER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. The City of Overland Park, Kansas, a Mayor-Council-City of the first class, by the power invested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to, and exempts itself from, and makes inapplicable to it. G.S. 1949, 13-1420, said section applying only to cities of the first class, and providing substitute and additional provisions as hereinafter set forth.

SECTION 2. The governing body shall designate an official newspaper for the official advertising of the City of Overland Park, Kansas, from time to time, by ordinance duly passed.

SECTION 3. The paper selected for the official advertising of the City of Overland Park shall have been published for at least one year prior to the publication of any official advertisement.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspaper.

SECTION 5. This is a charter ordinance and shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed and a referendum held on the ordinance as provided in Article 12, Section 5, subdivision (c) (3) of the Constitution of Kansas, in which case the ordinance shall become effective as approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

PASSED BY THE GOVERNING BODY NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS VOTING IN FAVOR THEREOF THE 14th DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1964.
