

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. SEVENTY-THREE

*(Note: All or parts of this charter ordinance have been repealed. See notes at the end of the ordinance.)*

A CHARTER ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REPEALING EXISTING SECTION 3 OF CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. FORTY-THREE RELATING TO THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. Existing Section 3 of Charter Ordinance No. Forty-three of the City of Overland Park is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 2 of Charter Ordinance No. Forty-three, as amended by Charter Ordinance No. Sixty-eight, the City shall have a Civil Service Commission and such Civil Service Commission shall have the jurisdiction, powers, duties and responsibilities as set forth in the ordinary ordinances of the City.

SECTION 2. Existing Section 3 of Charter Ordinance No. Forty-three is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the Overland Park Sun, an official City newspaper.

SECTION 4. THIS IS A CHARTER ORDINANCE AND SHALL TAKE EFFECT SIXTY-ONE DAYS AFTER FINAL PUBLICATION UNLESS WITHIN 60 DAYS OF ITS FINAL PUBLICATION A PETITION SIGNED BY A NUMBER OF ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK EQUAL TO NOT LESS THAN TEN PERCENT OF THE NUMBER OF ELECTORS WHO VOTED AT THE LAST PRECEDING REGULAR CITY ELECTION SHALL BE FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK OF OVERLAND PARK DEMANDING AN ELECTION ON THE CHARTER ORDINANCE, IN WHICH CASE THE CHARTER ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE ONLY IF AND WHEN APPROVED BY A MAJORITY OF THE ELECTORS VOTING THEREON.

PASSED by the Governing Body not less than two-thirds of the members elect voting in favor thereof the 15th day of February, 1999.
