

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. SIXTY-THREE

*(Note: All or parts of this charter ordinance have been repealed. See notes at the end of the ordinance.)*

A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS FROM SECTION 12-1036e OF THE KANSAS STATUTES ANNOTATED; PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE PROVISIONS ON THE SALARIES OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCILMEMBERS; AND REPEALING CHARTER ORDINANCE THIRTY-TWO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. City of Overland Park, Kansas, a Mayor-Council-City Manager city of the first class, by the power vested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to and exempts itself from and makes inapplicable to it, Section 12-1036e of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, which law applies only to Mayor-Council-City Manager cities of the first class, and to provide substitute provisions as herein provided.

SECTION 2. Commencing January 1, 1995, the salary of each City Councilmember shall be \$7,800 per year, payable monthly.

SECTION 3. Commencing January 1, 1995, the City Councilmember who serves as President of the Council shall also receive an additional \$1,200 per year, payable monthly while serving in that capacity.

SECTION 4. Commencing January 1, 1995, the salary of the Mayor shall be \$15,600 per year, payable monthly.

SECTION 5. The salaries of the Councilmembers, President of the Council and Mayor shall be reviewed at least once every four years.

SECTION 6. Charter Ordinance Thirty-Two is hereby repealed effective January 1, 1995.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in *The Overland Park Sun*, an official City newspaper.

SECTION 8. THIS IS A CHARTER ORDINANCE AND SHALL TAKE EFFECT 61 DAYS AFTER FINAL PUBLICATION UNLESS WITHIN 60 DAYS OF ITS FINAL PUBLICATION A PETITION SIGNED BY A NUMBER OF ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK EQUAL TO NOT LESS THAN TEN PERCENT OF THE NUMBER OF ELECTORS WHO VOTED AT THE LAST PRECEDING REGULAR CITY ELECTION SHALL BE FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK OF OVERLAND PARK DEMANDING AN ELECTION ON THE CHARTER ORDINANCE, IN WHICH CASE THE CHARTER ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE ONLY IF AND WHEN APPROVED BY A

MAJORITY OF THE ELECTORS VOTING THEREON.
