

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. THIRTY-TWO

(Note: All or parts of this charter ordinance have been repealed. See notes at the end of the ordinance.)

A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS FROM SECTION 12-1036e OF THE KANSAS STATUTES ANNOTATED; PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE PROVISIONS ON THE SALARIES OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCILPERSONS; AND REPEALING CHARTER ORDINANCES TWO; SIX; NINE AND TWENTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. City of Overland Park, Kansas, a Mayor-Council-City Manager city of the first class, by the power vested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to and exempts itself from and makes inapplicable to it, Section 12-1036e of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, which law applies only to Mayor-Council-City Manager cities of the first class, and to provide substitute provisions as herein provided.

SECTION 2. Commencing January 1, 1985, the salary of the Mayor shall be \$10,200 per year, payable monthly; and commencing January 1, 1987, the salary of the Mayor shall be \$12,000 per year, payable monthly.

SECTION 3. Commencing January 1, 1985, the salary of the President of the Council shall be \$6,600 per year, payable monthly.

SECTION 4. Commencing January 1, 1985, the salary of each City Councilperson shall be \$6,000 per year, payable monthly.

SECTION 5. The salaries of the Mayor, President of the Council, and Councilpersons shall be reviewed in the year 1988 as part of the 1989 budget process of the City and every four years thereafter.

SECTION 6. Charter Ordinances Two, Six, Nine and Twenty are hereby repealed effective January 1, 1985.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official City newspaper, Overland Park Sun.

SECTION 8. This is a Charter Ordinance and shall take effect 61 days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed and a referendum held on the ordinance as provided in Article 12, Section 5, subdivision (c)(3) of the Constitution of Kansas, in which case the ordinance shall become effective as approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
