Players have purchased memberships for many different reasons; however, the most popular benefits are advanced access to the Tee Time Reservation System and discounts on fees. As a Patron member, you are eligible for the following benefits:

1. Discount on green fees
2. Privilege of calling the Tee Time Reservation System or utilizing the website up to seven days in advance free of charge
3. The Overland Park and the St. Andrews Golf Clubs are members of the United States Golf Association, Kansas Golf Association, Kansas City Golf Association, Kansas Women's Golf Association, and Men's and Women's Public Links Associations. These associations allow our members with handicaps to participate in the organization's sponsored golf events
4. Patron members are eligible to purchase a USGA handicap.

# HOW TO RESERVE A TEE TIME

The automated Tee Time Reservation System (TTRS) allows golfers an easy and quick way to reserve, confirm or cancel tee time reservations seven days a week.

The system is not available between 8:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. each day.

To make a tee time, customers may call the TTRS at 913.341.8100 using a touch-tone phone or go online at [www.opkansas.org](http://www.opkansas.org). Patrons have access to tee times 7 days in advance; Non-Patrons have access to tee times 6 days in advance. Tee times are released to golfers at 9:00 p.m. for the following week.

## **Additional Tee Time Opportunities for Patrons and Non-Patrons:**

**Day of play tee times:** The golf courses often have open times available on the day of play. These open times are times that were available for booking through the TTRS but were not selected by customers. These times may be secured by telephoning the golf shop or by appearing in person at the golf course. When a person calls on the telephone to reserve these tee times, they are asked to provide a telephone number. We require this information to guard against the possibility of a "no show".

Any alterations to tee times must be made **48 hours** in advance of the tee time through the TTRS or at any time through the golf shops.

# COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT THE TEE TIME RESERVATION SYSTEM (TTRS)

**Question:** On Saturday nights in the summer, why is it that I can never get into the system until 20 minutes after the hour?

**Answer:** There are 16 phone lines and 25 internet connections which go into the system in the evenings. There are 5,000 Patron Card members who have the opportunity to make tee times 7 days in advance. **Recommendation:** If your weekend schedule allows you to be flexible, call on a day closer to the day you want to play. Players are asked to alter their tee times **48 hours** in advance of their tee times. As other golfers plans change and they cancel their tee times, you can take advantage of those recently opened times.

**Question:** I requested an 8:30 a.m. tee time; the system gave me 7:32 a.m. Why can't the system give me what I ask for?

**Answer:** The telephone system is programmed to search backwards and forward within one hour from the original time requested and then to search forward until a tee time can be offered. Without this feature, you would miss getting a tee time that was close, but a little earlier than what was requested.

**Question:** In the summertime, I got into the system at 9:04 p.m. and requested St. Andrews for a weekday morning at 7:30 a.m., I got 10:30 a.m. Is there something wrong with your system?

**Answer:** On the telephone system, the average length of the call into the TTRS is 1 minute, 20 seconds. (The fastest you can push all the buttons and reserve a time is about 40 seconds; if you follow all the prompts and listen to all of the messages, it's 2 minutes and 35 seconds.) The average Internet connection takes approximately 65 seconds (depending on your Internet Service Provider). With 16 incoming lines, and 25 Internet nodes, by the time this caller connects with the system, more than 100 golfers have already had their tee time requests confirmed. There are 7 available tee times each hour at each course. The first selection by golfers is normally St. Andrews, followed by South, North and then Westlinks.

# COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT THE TEE TIME RESERVATION SYSTEM (TTRS) (Cont'd)

**Question:** I'm calling at 9:00 p.m., trying to get a tee time. The golf courses are closed. When I have problems, who can I call for help?

**Answer:** There are Trouble Shooting Tips on the Information Line prompt on the TTRS line, 913.341.8100. In addition, the Overland Park Golf Club, 913.897.3809, is open until dark and the St. Andrews Golf Club, 913.897.3804, is open until 10:00 p.m. during the golf season. Either of these locations are glad to help you with specific problems.

**Question:** The same people get the good tee times week after week. Is the system rigged?

**Answer:** The system is not rigged, nor do some people or groups get preferential treatment. We invite anyone to review our tee sheets for accuracy and integrity. The people who get the same times each week work at it. For example, every Saturday evening at 9:00 p.m. the five golfers in a group call and all five of them get a tee time for the next Saturday morning. Later in the week, they compare the times, choose the best, finalize their plans, and hopefully cancel four of the times. That group has four more chances of getting a better tee time than you do. (See the notes on page 9 regarding access to the course. Also, see information on Westlinks Lottery on page 8.)

# WESTLINKS TEE TIME LOTTERY

## **Explanation:**

By lottery, the City of Overland Park's Golf Division will designate a standing reservation for a prescribed tee time slot for a five-some on Saturday and/or Sunday mornings during the First Wave on the Westlinks Golf Course. This reservation will be for the designated golf season, March through October. Because of the continual change of sunrise throughout the year, the designated tee time will not be hour and minute specific, but will instead be "first tee time, second tee time, etc."

## **Entry:**

All Golf Patron Card holders or Overland Park residents are eligible to participate in the lottery. Participants must have a current Patron Card or a current valid Drivers License displaying an Overland Park address. Overland Park business owners must present ownership papers and photo identification to the Manager of Golf Operations by January 31<sup>st</sup> in order to be included in the lottery.

## **Deposit Requirements:**

A refundable deposit of \$180 must accompany the application and that amount must be maintained throughout the golf season. The only time an amount will be deducted from the deposit is in the event of a No-Show. The deposit will be held as an assurance that five golfers will play every week and will be refunded at the end of the golf season in November.

## **Customer Commitment:**

The lottery winner must commit to five players each week from March 28 through October 31. The customer is responsible for knowing his specific tee time, hour and minute. It is the customer's responsibility to consult the annual Golf Program Book for the first tee time, and therefore know their own tee time, throughout the season. The customer is responsible for maintaining Pace of Play. Failure to comply with Pace of Play guidelines may result in action by the City to terminate the reservation agreement.

## **Cancellation Policy:**

Alterations to the tee time must be made through the Overland Park golf shop (913.897.3809 ext. 2) one week in advance of the day of play in order to avoid application of the deposit. Open slots within the tee time will be made available to other customers through the Tee Time Reservation System (TTRS).

The drawing for Westlinks tee times for 2009 will be held Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m. in the Overland Park golf shop. Entry forms will be available in the golf shop, and on line at the City's golf website, [www.opkansas.org](http://www.opkansas.org) on the GOLF page one month prior to the lottery.

# IMPROVING GOLF COURSE ACCESS

A tee time at either of the Overland Park Golf Courses is valuable. The volume of calls that are made to the automated Tee Time Reservation System (TTRS) confirm the popularity of our golf courses. For a person to get a premium tee time, it takes planning, coordination and perseverance. In order to assure that all Patrons have the opportunity to get tee times, it also takes cooperation.

TTRS provides fair access for all golfers. The circumstance, in which all five members of a group make a tee time and then the day before play cancel four of those times creates the greatest challenge regarding access. We encourage all golfers to be aware of the situation they create when their group makes multiple tee times and to be considerate of the other Patrons who are also trying to get "good" times.

Thank you for your help on this sensitive situation.

## "NO-SHOW"

**Note:** For the benefit of all golfers requesting opportunities to enjoy the City's golf courses, the following regulations apply:

- a. Players must modify their tee times, group sizes and courses **48 hours** prior to their tee time. Call the respective Golf Shop to modify within **48 hours**.
- b. Players not modifying their tee time and group sizes prior to **48 hours** before their tee time, could be declared a no-show.
- c. If a no-show reservation is filled with stand-by golfers, no penalties will occur towards the Patron member who reserved the tee time.

### No-Show Policy

- First Occurrence: The player's reservation privileges are deactivated. Re-instatement is done only by the golf course which deactivated the player.
- Second Occurrence: An automatic 14 day suspension of reservation privileges. All appeals to the decision will only be considered in writing and should be directed to Sandy Queen, Manager, Golf Course Operations. Email: [sandy.queen@opkansas.org](mailto:sandy.queen@opkansas.org).
- Third Occurrence: Revocation of reservation privileges for the remainder of the year.

# THE WAVE AT OVERLAND PARK GOLF CLUB (WEEKENDS & HOLIDAYS)

To maximize tee times on the Overland Park Golf Club, a starting method called the **Wave** is used which simply stated is, "starting groups off of each course simultaneously."

Up to 13 tee times are available on each course over a one hour and forty four minute period. All courses are then closed to "new" tee times in order to give all groups who started in the first segment an opportunity to turn for their second nine.

# READY GOLF PROGRAM

The Ready Golf Program is designed to improve the pace of play at the Overland Park and St. Andrews Golf Clubs, thereby making your golf game more enjoyable and providing more golfers an opportunity to play.

**Ready Golf** means:

- Check in with the Starter at least 16 minutes before the tee time. Players not present at least 16 minutes prior to their starting time may forfeit their reservation to standby golfers
- Be at the tee box five minutes before your tee time
- Safety first
- Tee off when ready - no honors
- Be ready to hit when it is your turn
- Hit when ready in the fairway
- Maintain your position on the course
- Putt out when ready - No honors
- Record scores at the next tee
- Keep up with the group in front of you

The many rounds played at Overland Park and St. Andrews Golf Courses require that we closely manage the play at the golf courses. Our Ready Golf Volunteer Program provides the organizational structure and personnel necessary to operate the golf courses effectively. The volunteer staff consists of the following:

**Starter:** Checks in golfers, verifies tee times, makes pairings and assigns tee times for the day of play

**Tee Manager:** Explains the Ready Golf Program, current course conditions, cart regulations, ensures golfers tee off in a timely manner and verifies receipts

**Player Assistant:** Monitors and controls the pace of play on the golf course and assists golfers when necessary

Our Ready Golf Program has been recognized both locally and nationally for several years and has received many awards. We have also shared our policies and procedures with many other golf courses around the country.

# TIPS FOR ELIMINATING SLOW PLAY

“Your place on the golf course is directly behind the group in front of you...  
Not directly in front of the group behind you!”

## On The Tee

1. Hit when ready and safe; do not use the honor system
2. Shorter hitters can hit first
3. Tee-off as soon as the group ahead is clear
4. Carry an extra ball in your pocket

## On The Fairway

5. Hit when ready and safe; do not use the honor system
6. Take appropriate clubs to your ball and hit without delay
7. Each group member should watch the other player's shots
8. Limit search for lost balls to three minutes
9. When you've reached double par, pick up and place ball on green
10. As a cart driver, drop your partner at their ball, then, continue to yours

## On The Green

11. Place your clubs between the green and the next tee
12. Study your putt while others are putting
13. Continue putting until holed out
14. Leave the green immediately after holing out and proceed to the next tee
15. Complete your scorecard when off the green and on the next tee

*We believe the majority of golfers who utilize the Overland Park golf courses would prefer to complete a round of golf in less than 4 ¼ hours during non peak times and less than 4 ½ hours during peak play on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. Player Assistants will monitor the pace of play and will inform the Duty Golf Professional of potential slow play situations. It is the player's responsibility to keep pace with the group ahead. Golfers making tee times on the City's golf courses may be paired with other golfers seeking to enjoy the facilities. Even though there may be unfamiliarity with the others in the group, it becomes the group's responsibility to set an acceptable pace consistent with the conditions on that particular day.*

# OVERLAND PARK GOLF COURSES

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Each player is expected to have reasonable knowledge of the game of golf before they purchase a green fee ticket for the regulation course. This reasonable knowledge may have been acquired through formal instructional programs; time spent practicing at a driving range or having played golf at a Par 3 or executive type course.
2. Each player is responsible to play the game of golf safely. Players should be knowledgeable about their own ability or lack of ability so as not to hit into other golfers on the golf course. Golfers are responsible to ensure that their intended or possible landing zone is free and clear of other golfers prior to hitting their shots.
3. Players must be able to present a greens fee ticket when it is requested on the course. In order to receive a Patron discount, the Patron Card must be presented with each transaction.
4. Each golfer, on the regulation course, must have a set of clubs. On the Par 3 Course, clubs may be shared between two players
5. Practicing is prohibited on the golf course.
6. Players not reporting to the starter 16 minutes before their tee time may lose that starting time and be placed in the next open time.
7. Groups not maintaining their position on the golf course may receive two warnings to regain their position. Groups failing to comply may be required by the Golf Professional to immediately move into the appropriate position. Groups that do not comply may be removed from the golf course.
8. Singles, twosomes, and threesomes may be required to join together into foursomes, fivesomes or sixsomes when it is deemed appropriate for managing play.
9. Proper golf attire must be worn at all times. Bathing attire, tank tops, tube tops, halter-tops, mesh shirts, short shorts, muscle shirts, and dress of similar nature is inappropriate.
10. Nonmetal spikes or smooth soled tennis shoes are allowed. The Golf Professionals may at their discretion allow various other types of golf shoes.

# OVERLAND PARK GOLF COURSES

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

### (Cont'd.)

11. Players not conducting themselves in an orderly and a sportsmanlike manner or not in compliance with the golf course rules and regulations may be evicted from the premises by the Duty Golf Professional, Manager, Golf Course Operations or Golf Course Superintendent.
12. All play is governed by the local rules and regulations and the rules of the United States Golf Association, which are on file at the clubhouse.
13. The practice and lesson tees at Overland Park and St. Andrews Golf Clubs will occasionally be closed for maintenance and at such time as weather dictates; the Golf Course Superintendent or Manager, Golf Course Operations will make that determination. Players must hit balls from between the tee markers at all times. No one may be permitted beyond the practice tee.
14. Residential status for determining sale of Patron Cards shall be determined by current driver's license. A resident is considered to be anyone living in the city of Overland Park whose address can be verified by a current driver's license. Players submitting a fraudulent driver's license will be deactivated for one year will not receive a refund and will be reported to the proper authorities.
15. Any non-resident of Overland Park who is an owner of a business or real estate property in Overland Park shall be eligible to purchase a resident golf Patron Card.

The request is made to the Manager, Golf Course Operations. The Manager will verify ownership of real estate property or business by property tax statements, deeds, franchise agreements, etc. Only those owners who are individually named as owners and can provide adequate documentation to verify ownership are eligible for resident status.

Once the Manager determines that someone should be granted resident status, he will notify the golf professionals accordingly and that person may purchase a resident Patron Card at either golf course.

16. No one under the age of eight is allowed onto the regulation golf courses. No one under the age of five is allowed on the Par 3 Course.

# OVERLAND PARK GOLF CLUB STATS

One of the most popular and best maintained courses in the area, Overland Park Golf Club consists of 27 regulation golf holes, configured as three 18-hole courses, South, North and West, along with a challenging 9-hole Par-3 course. # SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

The staff of the golf division would like to thank you for your support of our operation. We know that you have options on where to play. We strive to be the best value from which to choose. Our memberships in both the Heart of America Golf Course Superintendents Association (HAGCSA) and the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) are very important to us. Through the continuing education programs provided by these organizations we are able to implement the latest techniques into our operations. This in turn provides you with the best possible conditions on a consistent basis. The maintenance staffs continue to avail themselves of the educational programs provided by the HAGCSA and the GCSAA. The scientific and technological advances that are being made in the field of turfgrass management and our exposure to those advancements help us continue to provide the best recreational experience to our customers.

At St. Andrews this was the first full season for our new six holes. We were very pleased on how the new greens, tees and fairways progressed throughout the 2008 season. With this full year of growth, the grasses have matured and we are now able to mow to a shorter height. We now consider the grasses on these new holes not as "grow in", but on the same par as our other holes, "maintenance" mode. This maintenance mode means that the greens will not grow as fast during the day. These means more consistent greens speeds throughout the entire day. These new holes certainly offer beautiful views and a greater challenge than the old six holes.

Other improvements made last season were the new entry sign, landscaping of the parking lot islands, along with installing electricity to the restroom on #12 and running power to the fans around several greens.

At the Overland Park course, a great deal of work was done to improve the playing aspects of the golf courses. At Westlinks, a new program involving foliar nutrients was implemented to bring to completion our fairway Zoysia conversion at that course. As you saw this past spring, we were very aggressive in eliminating the remainder of the cool season grasses.

As the summer and fall progressed, we witnessed great success with that program and we are all eagerly looking forward to the coming spring and fully enjoying those new Zoysia fairways. Another project that was worked on was the change in grasses to the greens surrounds. A few years back, we had a very successful greens reconstruction at our other course, St. Andrews. Golfers noticed those new greens surrounds and were very complimentary. Keeping in mind those positive comments, we began a conversion from Zoysia to Bentgrass collars around most of the greens on the North and South courses. This change provides players a consistent playing surface on all three courses, and creates a barrier between the Zoysia fairways and the Bentgrass Greens. Another major customer affecting project which we completed in 2008 was the reconstruction of the Driving Range.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

These new target greens and the appearance of fairways provide an optimal place for golfers to practice their golf game.

At both golf courses a major ongoing project is tree removal and replanting. As many of our patrons have witnessed, some of the evergreens on the golf course have had an infestation of Pine Wilt. This is a serious disease and because of that, we found it necessary to remove many of those affected trees. Evergreens are an important part of winter bird habitat something that we do not want to lose, so in spring 2009 we will be planting new evergreen trees.

At both St. Andrews and Overland Park, we are taking steps toward becoming a "greener" golf course and in educating players on the environmental friendliness of that our courses offer to golfers and the surrounding wildlife. In 2008 we began an internal program, Golf Goes Green (G3). G3 means a lot more than just the grass on the golf courses. It means that we are reviewing all of our environmental impacts on the golf courses, the buildings, the equipment and our practices. We're doing a complete overview of all our operations, from golf carts and gasoline consumption and emissions to mowing and watering schedules. We believe that a golf course is not just a golf course and it's a place not just for golfers. It's also wildlife habitat, water filtration and water holding areas and importantly it is green space.

As part of G3, some of the things we did this past year include the installation of 14 Bluebird houses erected throughout the course. These new birdhouses had a fifty percent nesting rate for the first year, which is a very positive number. On April 20, 2008, Earth Day, we led efforts in a golf course cleanup. Golf Division staff, concerned golfers and volunteers collected debris from around our ponds and outlying areas. Our staff really appreciated the efforts of those concerned citizens in helping us keep our course beautiful for our golfing patrons and our neighbors.
