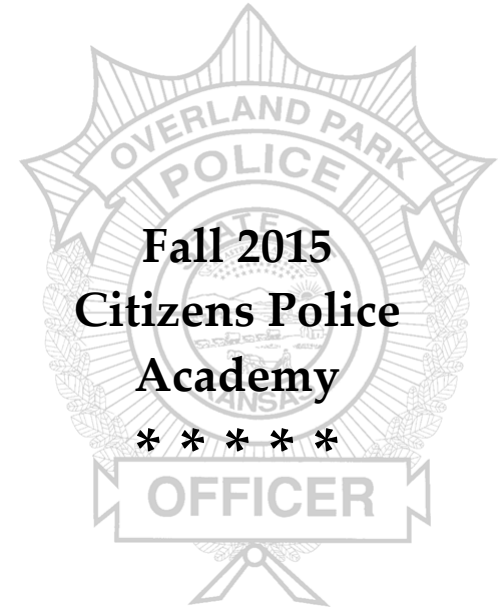

What is the Citizens Police Academy?

The OPPD Citizens Police Academy is a 28-hour course designed to give the citizens a working knowledge about the structure and activities of the Police Department. Participants will see through the eyes of the Instructors, and “hands on” practicals, into what it’s like to be an Overland Park Police Officer.

The belief behind our Academy is **E.P.I.C.**, Encouraging a Positive and Interactive Community. The goal of the Academy is to create educated citizens on basic information regarding the police profession. These citizens can then return to their neighborhoods better informed. The goal is to better and improve the relationship between the community and the police department.

Who may attend the Citizens Police Academy?

Applicants must be at least 18 years old and have no criminal record. Criminal history background checks will be conducted on all applicants. Persons selected to attend the Academy are expected to participate in 7 out of 8 sessions. If this is not possible, please do not apply due to limited class size.

Applicants may apply through www.opkansas.org at the Citizens Police Academy page. This Academy is not designed for Police Officer candidates. It is an overview of the police department for the purpose of community members.

No fee is charged for the Citizens Police Academy. Our Officers and other personnel teaching in the Academy provide their services and expertise to the members of the class as part of the program.

What subjects are taught?
